
Alumni also interacted with the students and gave motivational talk regarding preparing for higher studies and placements. Students asked many questions regarding placements and the alumni shared their views.



General Rules –

- Get library account number /borrow card on your first day in college from librarian.
- Student should enter their names in the entry register.
- Student can issue 2 library books on library account /borrow card for a week.
- Renewal of the books will depend on availability and requirement of the same by others.
- Loss of I-card/ borrow card should be reported to the librarian immediately.
- Issue of duplicate I-card/borrow cards will be made against due charges.
- Student can avail the facility of reference books/ journals/ periodicals within the library premises only against I-card.
- The fine of Rs.2/day will be charged on the return of books issued on library account/ borrow card.
- Writing or scribbling on or tearing of pages of library books, newspapers, journals, periodicals etc. is prohibited & will be liable for strict action.
- Student should produce their identity cards as & when demanded by the library staff
- Use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited inside the library.
- Difficulties if any should be discussed with the Librarian.
- On loss of library book user shall replace the same with a brand new copy of latest edition or to pay the amount decided by library committee.
- Students should enter their names in the entry register.
- I-card/ borrower's card is not transferable.
- Complete silence should be maintained. Group discussions, lectures are not allowed in the library.
- On the last day each semester don't forget to return all issued books.

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Quality of student's projects

Processes related to project identification, allotment, continuous monitoring, evaluation including demonstration of working prototypes and enhancing the relevance of projects. Mention Implementation details including details of POs and PSOs addressed through the projects with justification)

a) Formation of Project Review Committee (PRC)

- PRC of department consists of Head of the department as Chairman, two senior faculties as experts and the project coordinator.
- PRC conducts periodic meetings and ensures smooth execution of projects and evaluations.

b) Formation of Batches:

- Project batches are formed as per guidelines given by Board of studies Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Technological University and project review committee (PRC).
- It consists of one topper having at least First Class with Distinction/First Class and choice given by students as per their interest to accommodate in particular batch.

c) Guide Allotment

- All faculties having minimum experience of 02 years are given at least one project batch and maximum of two batches.
- Guide allotment is done impartially. Students requested to faculty for guidance for their group in the classroom.
- Guides having equal experience in terms of years and specializations like Structural Engineering, Environment Engineering, Concrete Technology, construction Management and Interdisciplinary projects are distributed in the batches of respective class.

a) Identification of Projects and Allocation Methodology

- The student's projects are selected in line with department mission, vision and program outcomes (POs).
- Students are given brief idea of various fields for selecting the project ideas.



- The list of previous year projects is displayed at notice board which ensures no repetition of project work and also encourages students to improve earlier works.
- Every faculty member suggests at least four topics of project to the group allotted to him.
- The group members are asked to collect ideas from industrial and social problems to boost innovations and creativity.
- From above topics preference is given to the vital issues in industries and societies to solve it and to achieve POs
- Project is undertaken in the college under the supervision of Head of the Department & Two Senior Faculty and the work is monitored by the project review committee.
- This work meets the course outcomes COs which in turn meet the corresponding POs.

b) Assessment and Outcome of Project

- Project review is conducted for every month.
- Based on the reviews suggestions or modifications are given to the students.
- Projects are reviewed based on the outputs or results of the projects.
- Project rubrics are developed to ensure attainment of course outcomes and to assess individual and team performance. It includes identification of problem and title of project, literature review, schematic design of work, complexity level, use of modern engineering tool, applications, result interpretation and conclusion, individual contribution, team work, leadership, confidence, presentation, periodic progress and interactions, overall contribution etc. Each student is monitored by research guide for the same. This adds in quality of assessment and monitoring.
- For term-work marks allotment, suitable breakup of marks for guide and PRC is taken.
- Students are encouraged for paper publications based on projects.
- Projects exhibitions are conducted.
- Best projects and prize winning projects are encouraged.

Yashoda Technical Campus (hereinafter YTC) is to engage itself in assimilating and imparting knowledge and provide a nurturing environment to students and faculty to apply the science, technology and engineering principles in innovative projects. YTC recognizes that creative endeavors are a natural outcome of the pursuit of this mission. Accordingly the institute has been encouraging students and faculty to innovate through research work such that it qualifies for patenting and protection. YTC also recognizes that the efficient management of research activity and related intellectual property rights (IPRs) would strengthen the institute and provide a strong foundation for growth of human resources, research projects and technologies. To sustain the focus and to support of these goals, YTC is providing policy guidelines for inventions, copyrightable works, trademark and other related intellectual property rights arising from the activities of its faculty, staff, students and other who use YTC internal as well as external (those provided through an externally funded grant, contact, or other type of award or gift to the institution) resources.

STATEMENT OF POLICY:

A. Inventions

- 1. Principle of YTC Ownership:** The YTC shall own each and every invention conceived, in whole or in part, during the course of any employment, research or scholarship activity of any YTC students, Research scholars, faculty, relating to the use of YTC resources
- 2. Invention Disclosure:** All original inventions shall be disclosed promptly by the inventors on prescribed invention disclosure form (Annexure-I) and assign each invention to the YTC or its authorized designee. The inventors shall refrain from disclosing any invention of any third party unless appropriately authorized by the YTC or its designee. In case of joint inventions, by multiple inventors, the invention disclosure form shall include names of all contributing inventors. The form shall constitute a full and complete disclosure of the invention subject matter and the identity of all individuals participating there in. The invention disclosure form shall be submitted to Director/ Dean R&D YTC, who would provide his recommendation to the Principal and process further for registration / filing with patent office.
- 3.** While no public disclosure of the invention is permitted prior to registration/ allocation of priority date from patent office however in doubtful (non-patentable) cases the inventors/researchers should get the recommendation from the Dean (R & D), YTC for approval by the principal YTC to this effect. All relevant documents data, background material shall be finished by the inventors/researchers along with such requests.

B. Copyrightable Works:

 - III. **License to YTC for instructional or scholarly copyrightable works:** Each instructional or scholarly copyrightable work shall by operation of this policy, be subject to a perpetual non-exclusive, royalty-free license from the author to the YTC to use, duplicate, and internally distribute the instructional or scholarly copyrightable work for any pedagogical, research, or educational purpose of the YTC, subject to attribution of original authorship and to internal academic procedures and requirements of YTC. The foregoing license shall be broadly construed to enable the YTC's efforts to preserve research integrity and prevent fabrications, falsification and plagiarism.
- C. **Trademarks:** YTC owns all rights, title and interest in trademarks that relate to YTC intellectual property or relate to a program of education, service, public relations, research or training by the YTC.
- D. **Tangible Research Property and Research Data:** YTC owns all rights, title and interest in tangible research property and research data developed with support from YTC resources. All research work with associated data including results should be **recorded in a suitable research note book** as per the guidelines available with Dean (R&D), YTC. In most instances, except externally funded research (section- J), the YTC allows access of YTC owned tangible research property or research data to YTC personnel at the discretion of the **principal** (duly recommended by Dean (R&D), YTC) for furtherance of research, innovation and similar other non-commercial purposes.
- E. **Respecting others IPRs:** YTC through this IPR policy notifies all YTC students, research scholars, faculty and associates to respect IPR's owned by other and not to use IPR's owned by others for any project, research, teaching or **reference**. The research fraternity at YTC shall comply to following guideline:



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- F.** Initiate and obtain appropriate authorization from the owners of such IPR's prior to use and acknowledge such use appropriately. Improper use by any YTC personnel, if any, would be treated as plagiarism and would be considered an offence. Principal, YTC would initiate/take necessary disciplinary and other legally required action for such offence.
- G. Administration and execution of IPR policy:** The IPR policy will be managed by Dean (R&D), YTC. The principal and the Dean (R&D), YTC would have the authority to enforce the sections of the IPR policy and also to review and amend the sections as and when required.
- H. Disposition of YTC intellectual property:** this policy shall be deemed as:
- A term and condition of employment for every employee of the YTC.
 - A term and condition of enrollment and attendance at the YTC by students and
- I.** A term and condition of participation in any YTC research or other use of YTC resources by any person (whether or not employed by compensated by enrolled at the YTC). This would include:
- J. Outside activities authorized by the YTC:** for YTC faculty or staff remain subject to this policy to the extent this policy does not conflict with any other existing policy applicable to third party in case of a conflict, the ownership of all IP emanating from such outside activities (collaborative work) will be mutually decided through discussions on case by case basis.
- As directed and requested by the YTC and or its designee, all creation of YTC intellectual property shall **execute legal documents** required to effect this policy. The YTC (on its own behalf and on behalf its designee)
 - reserves the sole right in its exclusive discretion to make agreements regarding the retention ownership, patenting licensing accessing and any other use or dispositions of any right, title or Interest in YTC intellectual property.
 - The YTC or its designee will determine whether to commit funding to obtain patent, copyright or trademark protection for particular disclosed YTC intellectual property and / or to seek to identify one or more licensee who will bear the cost of obtaining that legal protection. No creator of YTC intellectual property has the authority to assign, license or otherwise dispose of YTC intellectual property except to the YTC or its designee pursuant to this agreement. YTC personnel engaged in outside activities shall have no authority to enter into an intellectual property agreement that conflicts with this policy. Persons who wish to confirm that a consulting employment or other agreement that addresses assignment of intellectual property associated with a proposed outside activity does not conflict with this policy should submit a copy of the agreement for review by YTC.




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Director

I. Commercialization of Intellectual Property:

K. Patents: YTC may pursue commercialization of the patents owned by it and any revenue from such Commercialization may be distributed.

I. Equities of Participating Parties:

General Policy: Income derived by the YTC and /or its designee directly from the commercialization of YTC Intellectual Property shall be administered in accordance with this policy. It is the policy of YTC to encourage and recognize the creative efforts of YTC personnel and to share the financial rewards of such efforts on an equitable basis. This general policy may be rescinded or amended at any time by the YTC, and all legally enforceable rights related to Tangible Research Property and Research Data (Intellectual Property or proceeds there from) owned presently or in future by the Institution will remain with the Institution.

II. General Principle of Division: In most instances, Net Proceeds will be distributed according to the following formula: a) one-third ($1/3^{\text{rd}}$) to the YTC, and b) two – thirds ($2/3^{\text{rd}}$) to inventors comprising of YTC or other personnel who created the YTC Intellectual Property that gives rise to the Net Proceeds. Any agreement among those YTC personnel setting relative distribution shares among themselves shall be decided, a priori while registering the IPR. If necessary, the Principal may authorize a variance from the forgoing principles, depending upon the circumstances of an individual case, including relevant contractual arrangements and any applicable funding regulations.

III. Re-conveyance of YTC Intellectual Property: Intellectual Property may be re-conveyed to the YTC personnel who disclosed it, upon their request to the Principal, YTC, if the re-conveyance would not:

- Violate any legal obligations of or to the YTC,
- Limit appropriate YTC uses of the materials,
- Create an unmanageable conflict of interest for the inventor/creator,
- Have significant commercial or public value which may best be exploited by the YTC itself, or
- Otherwise conflict with YTC goals or principles.

L. Works of Independent Contractors: A written agreement will be documented from independent contractors such as website developers, architects, building contractors, interior decorators, special software developers, etc. that ownership of inventions / Copyrightable works made in the course of YTC retention will be assigned to the YTC.

- a. Designee: The YTC may designate Dean (R&D) YTC or any other representative to act for it in any respect hereunder.
- b. Amendments: This memorandum may be amended or withdrawn in whole or in part at any time by the principal of the YTC.



Title of the Practice: Enhance in concentration through Yoga

Goal:

Its main goals are to maintain Physical health, mental health, Social health, Spiritual health, Self-realization of Stakeholder.

The Context:

Focus on exercise related to breathing a meditation Anulom Vilom, Dhyadharana and Clapping makes stakeholder healthier in body, mind. It also improve strength muscle tone, stamina, concentration, it built positive Energy.

A] ANULOM VILOM:

Anulom Vilom Pranayama (अनुलोमप्राणायाम) is one of several Pranayama or breathing exercise used in the practice of Hatha yoga. At first, you have to understand the meaning of Anulom and Viloma. In this, the first word Anu roughly translates as with and word Loma means hair implying “with the grain” or “natural”. And the meaning of Viloma is “against the grain.”

Anulom is opposite to Viloma. It is very helpful in respiratory-related diseases like Asthma. Anulom Vilom Pranayama is the best way of balancing the tri doses in our body. Our body gets ill when Tri doses are not in balancing position. Vat, Pitta, Kaffa knows as tri doses, Tri means “three” and the meaning of doses is impurities. All these are present in the body of every people.

We perform this activity because it helps to regulate flow of vital energy throughout the body, it links between the physical body and soul, healing physical and mental disorders.




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Method:

1. Keep neck and spine erect and straight
2. Keep the body relax

B) MEDITATION:

Aim of activity is overall transformation and grooming of personality by bringing about positive attitudinal and behavioral changes. It helps to maintain harmony between sympathetic and parasympathetic nervous system. If we practice, gradually our distracting thoughts will subside and we will experience a sense of inner peace and relaxation. Our mind will feel lucid and spacious and we will feel refreshed. When the sea is rough, sediment is churned up and the water becomes murky, but when the wind dies down the mud gradually settles and the water becomes clear. In the same way, when the incessant flow of our distracting thoughts is pacified through concentrating on the breath, our mind becomes unusually lucid and clear. We should sit with this state of mental calm for a while.

Even though breathing meditation is only a preliminary stage of meditation, it can be very powerful. We can see from this practice that it is possible to experience inner peace and contentment just by controlling the mind, without having to rely at all upon external conditions.

When the turbulence of distracting thoughts subsides and our mind becomes still, a deep happiness and contentment naturally arises from within. This feeling of contentment and well-being helps us to cope with the busyness and difficulties of daily life. Much of the stress and tension we normally experience comes from our mind, and many of the problems we experience, including ill health, are caused or aggravated by this stress. Just by doing breathing meditation for ten or fifteen minutes each day, we will be able to reduce this stress. We will experience a calm, spacious feeling in the mind, and many of our usual problems will fall away. Difficult situations will become easier to deal with, we will naturally feel warm and well disposed towards other people, and our relationships with others will gradually improve.



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Steps:


Step I: To stop distracting thoughts and make our mind clearer and more lucid. This can be achieved by practicing a simple breathing meditation.

Step II: We choose a quiet place to meditate and then sit in a comfortable position. We can sit in the traditional cross-legged posture or in any other position that is comfortable. If we wish, we can sit in a chair.

Step III: It is important to keep our back straight to prevent our mind from becoming sluggish or sleepy. We sit with our eyes partially closed and turn our attention to our breathing. We try to breathe naturally, preferably through the nostrils, without attempting to control our breath, and become aware of the sensation of the breath as it enters and leaves the nostrils. This sensation is our object of meditation. We should try to concentrate on it to the exclusion of anything else.

Step IV: To start with, our mind will be very busy, and it might even seem that the meditation is making our mind busier; but in reality we are just starting to notice how busy our mind actually is. There will be a great temptation to follow the different thoughts as they arise, but we should resist this and remain focused single-pointedly on the sensation of the breath.

Step V: If we notice that our mind has wandered and is following our thoughts, we should immediately return it to the breath. We should repeat this as many times as necessary until the mind settles on the breath.

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C) CLAPPING:

Aim of this activity is release stress, bringing positive energy in our mind.





E-waste or electronic waste is created when an electronic product is discarded after the end of its useful life. E-waste mainly includes obsolete electronic devices, such as computer systems, servers, monitors, compact discs (CDs), printers, scanners, copiers, calculators, fax machines, battery cells etc. E-waste is disposed off through vendors.

Electronic waste or e-waste describes discarded electrical or electronic devices. Yashoda Technical Campus, Satara has created a hardware laboratory which includes outdated E-Waste material such as non-working computers, CPUs, monitors, keyboards, mouse as well as which are not in use and periodically handed over to the certified vendors for disposal. Our college also keeps the old project records which were created by the final year students in this laboratory for study purpose.

The equipment such as non-working computers, monitors, power supplies, printers, keyboards, mouse etc. are. The University has certified vendor for disposal of E-waste material as per prevailing norms without harming the environment.

The electronic waste components such as computer system components, CPU and ICs are repaired for minor defects and give to the colleges as an gift and if not repaired are handed to the scrap.


Computers, servers, mainframes, monitors, compact discs (CDs), printers, scanners, copiers, calculators, fax machines, battery cells, cellular phones, TVs, iPods, medical apparatus, 5 refrigerators, and air conditioners are the general type of E-Waste generated in the campus. E-waste consists of toxic elements such as Lead, Mercury, Cadmium, Chromium etc. The unscientific disposal of E-Waste can generate a threat to the environment as well as to human health. Due to the presence of these toxic substances in E-Waste, recycling and disposal of E-Waste becomes an important issue. The Institution can play a key role in management of E-Waste by following initiatives such as Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR); Design for Environment (DfE); Reduce, Reuse, Recycle (3Rs), with increased reuse and recycling rates, and adopt sustainable consumer habits.

Best Practices in the Institution -E-Waste Management:

- Effort to utilize the Extended Producer Responsibility
- Use of reusable resources in all possible areas
- E-Waste generated is channelized through authorized recycler for treatment, dismantling and disposal
- Adequate efforts put in to ensure that no damage is caused to the environment during storage and transportation of the E-Waste.

REPORT OF TEACHER'S DAY



Report of INDUCTION Program




Friendship day usually celebrated in the month of August. Students decided to celebrate the friendship in different manner.

The initiative for the arrangement of program was taken by student council.



5. The practice benefits cardiovascular and immune health.


Problems:


